





Atlantic – Hurricane Nadine (Cat 1)

- Hurricane force winds extend 35 miles; tropical storm force winds extend 115 miles






Eastern Pacific – Tropical Outlook






Central Pacific – Tropical Outlook






National Weather Forecast







Precipitation Forecast Days 1-3






Texas Rain Event – Update

- Widespread rain occurred Sept 29 across southern and central TX
- Rainfall expected to be light today as system moves east into Tennessee and Lower Mississippi valleys
- Flooding temporarily closed some roads in Wimberley, TX
- Colorado River near Ballinger crested Saturday afternoon at 27.72 feet Major Flood Stage (Flood Stage 18 feet)
 - 200 residents in Ballinger (Runnels County) temporarily evacuated; residents have returned home
 - Moderate flood levels at other locations on Colorado River
 - No other communities expected to be significantly impacted
- Local rivers have crested and currently at minor flood stage
- Texas SEOC at Level III (Increased Readiness)
- FEMA Region VI at Watch/Steady State
- No fatalities/injuries
- No request for FEMA assistance






River Flood Outlook – 7 Day






Convective Outlook Days 1-3






Critical Fire Weather Areas Days 1 - 8





Hazard Outlook: October 1-5







Sunspot Activity




US Wildland Fire Preparedness Levels


